



Responsibilities

Teaching at the undergraduate and graduate-level; supervising field experiences and clinical practice; fostering relationships with teachers and administrators across the state, and supporting schools within the region; mentoring candidates of diverse cultures and backgrounds; and participating in service at the department, college, and university levels.

Required Qualifications

- A Ph.D. or Ed.D. in Elementary Education, Science Education, or a closely related field by appointment date;
- Three years teaching experience in K-8 grades;
- Demonstrated commitment to excellence in teaching and learning, as well as scholarship;
- Commitment to diversity and inclusion.



Preferred Qualifications

- Face-to-Face and Online teaching experience;
- College-level teaching experience in elementary science methods;
- A record of effective teaching appropriate to the applicant's career stage;
- Ability to work effectively in a collaborative setting;
- A record of mentoring students of diverse backgrounds.
