The University of Queensland (UQ) contributes positively to society by engaging in the creation, preservation, transfer and application of knowledge. UQ ranks in the world's top universities, as measured by several key independent ranking, including the CWTS Leiden Ranking (32), the Performance Ranking of Scientific Papers for World Universities (43), the US News Best Global Universities Rankings (42), QS World University Rankings (48), Academic Ranking of World Universities (55), and the Times Higher Education World University Rankings (69). Excluding the award component, UQ is now ranked 45th in the world in the ARWU, and is one of the only two Australian universities to be included in the global top 50.

UQ has an outstanding reputation for the quality of its teachers, its educational programs and employment outcomes for its students. Our students remain at the heart of what we do. The UQ experience – the UQ Advantage – is distinguished by a research enriched curriculum, international collaborations, industry engagement and opportunities that nurture and develop future leaders. UQ has a strong focus on teaching excellence, winning more national teaching excellence awards than any other in the country and attracting the majority of Queensland's highest academic achievers, as well as top interstate and overseas students.

UQ is one of Australia's Group of Eight, a charter member of edX and a founding member of Universitas 21, an international consortium of leading research-intensive universities.

Our 52,000-plus strong student community includes more than 16,400 postgraduate scholars and more than 15,400 international students from 135 countries, adding to its proud 250,000-plus alumni. The University has more than 6,600 academic and professional staff (full-time equivalent) and a \$1.75 billion annual operating budget. Its major campuses are at St Lucia, Gatton and Herston, in addition to teaching and research sites around Queensland and Brisbane city. The University has six Faculties and four University-level Institutes. The Institutes, funded by government and industry grants, philanthropy and commercialisation activities, have built scale and focus in research areas in neuroscience, biomolecular and biomedical sciences, sustainable minerals, bioengineering and nanotechnology, as well as social science research.

UQ has an outstanding track-record in commercialisation of our innovation with major technologies employed across the globe and integral to gross product sales of \$11billion+ (see <http://uniquet.com.au/our-track-record>).

UQ has a rapidly growing record of attracting philanthropic support for its activities and this will be a strategic focus going forward.

Organisational Environment

The Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences (HASS) is a large, multi-disciplinary Faculty with a broad academic profile, substantial research achievements and a commitment to public engagement. The Faculty is based at the St Lucia campus in the iconic Forgan Smith building, at the heart of the University - The Great Court.

HASS has entered an era of regenerative leadership. Executive Dean Professor Heather Zwicker joined UQ in spring 2018, and brings a fresh vision of interdisciplinary collaboration, public accountability and commitment to the student experience. Many Heads of School are also new to their roles and eager to ensure that HASS continues to be a powerhouse for disciplinary and interdisciplinary research across our Schools, Institutes and Centres, as well as boasting exciting, responsive teaching in a broad range of programs.

The Faculty comprises seven Schools (Communication & Arts; Education; Historical & Philosophical Inquiry; Languages & Cultures; Music; Political Science & International Studies; Social Science), two research Institutes (Institute for Social Science Research; Institute for Advanced Studies in the Humanities), two museums (Anthropology Museum and the RD Milns Antiquities Museum), a Centre for Policy Futures, and several school-based research centres. It also plays host to the Institute for Modern Languages and the Confucius Institute.

HASS has a strong identity and long tradition of innovation and leadership, offering a broad range of programs - including one of UQ's largest, the Bachelor of Arts.

The complementary nature of our disciplines attract a diverse cohort of international and domestic students, with 640 research higher degree students, approximately 1,600 students in postgraduate coursework degrees and close to 7,000 undergraduates.

The Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences produces nationally and internationally regarded research across its many and varied disciplines. In addition to strong performance with external funding, UQ researchers in humanities and social sciences have won prizes, gained reputations for research excellence, performed exceptionally in the Excellence for Research in Australia (ERA) exercise and in global university rankings, among many other measures.

DUTY STATEMENT

Primary Purpose of Position

A Lecturer will be expected to teach STEAM focused courses (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts and Mathematics) primarily in the School's undergraduate and postgraduate Initial Teacher Education primary programs and postgraduate programs in areas relevant to their expertise. The successful appointee will have the capacity to pursue a strong and productive program of research relevant to the School's existing and emerging research priorities and to supervise research students. The appointee will be expected to undertake administration, service, and leadership roles commensurate with their level of appointment.

Duties

Duties and responsibilities include, but are not limited to:

Teaching and Learning

- Develop, co-ordinate and deliver undergraduate and postgraduate courses in the School's Initial Teacher Education programs and the postgraduate coursework programs
- Develop, co-ordinate and manage academic programs and projects as required

- Participate in and lead School-wide activities and planning relating to teaching and learning.

Research

- Conduct a productive program of research in an area relevant to your expertise and to the priorities of the School
- Apply for external research funding and work collaboratively with researchers within the School and across the University
- Publish high quality scholarly journal articles, reports, book chapters, monographs and texts
- Present research work at relevant conferences and other professional and community forums
- Supervise honours and research higher degree students.

Service and Engagement

- Foster the School's relations with organisational units in the University, industry, government departments, professional bodies and the wider community
- Provide leadership and support within the teaching profession
- Contribute to the School's links with community, industry, government and professional organisations and groups
- Promote the School's research and teaching programs
- Contribute to the processes that enable the academic team to manage the work of the School, including participation in School decision-making and service on School committees
- Perform a range of administrative functions in the School including representing the School in marketing campaigns such as tertiary expos and Open Day.

SELECTION CRITERIA

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Essential

- PhD in the area of Education, with a tertiary degree in a STEAM Education discipline area. Preference will be given to expertise in technology;
- Hold, or be eligible to hold, a valid teacher registration with the Queensland College of Teachers;
- Hold, or be eligible to hold, a valid Queensland Government Blue Card;
- Demonstrated ability and enthusiasm for engaging in high quality teaching in the primary Initial Teacher Education programs and a field of study in the postgraduate coursework programs addressing all aspects of teaching practice, including curriculum design, development of learning materials, analysis of learning needs of students, identification of appropriate approaches to teaching, and development of formative and summative assessment appropriately linked to learning goals. Evidence of teaching evaluations is required;
- Ability to work harmoniously within a team, while maintaining an individual profile in a research area;
- Excellent interpersonal skills and the ability to represent and promote the School at a university and wider community level, including industry, government and professional bodies;
- Excellent written and verbal communication skills in English, the language of instruction at The University of Queensland;
- An emerging track record of high quality publications;
- Demonstrated links with relevant professional organisations, industry, government and community groups.

Desirable

- Ability to develop online course materials and to use alternative modes of teaching, digital technologies, and flexible learning options;

Personal Qualities

Essential

- Demonstrated ability to work collaboratively with colleagues and to contribute to the collegial life of the School including academic projects and administration;

Seminar

Applicants invited for interview may be expected to present a research and/or teaching seminar in conjunction with the selection interview process.
