Open Rank Faculty Search (Assistant, Associate, or Full Professor)

Tenure Track

The University of Missouri (MU) seeks two Science Education scholars and educators to work with internationally-recognized faculty in the Department of Learning, Teaching, & Curriculum. The applicant with an active research agenda or a demonstrated potential for research productivity, as well as the potential for success in college teaching and academic program development, is encouraged to apply.

Responsibilities: The successful candidates will (a) teach undergraduate science education courses that lead to teaching licensure; (b) teach and advise MEd and PhD science education students; (c) build or maintain an active research agenda in science education; (d) actively pursue and secure external funding; (e) be involved with local, state, and national activities that support science education; and (f) participate in service to the program, department, college, and university.

Minimum Qualification: Earned doctorate at the time of employment.

Preferred Qualifications: Applicants will be evaluated based upon the following criteria:

- (a) Experience or expertise in teacher preparation programs and courses, particularly with regard to the teaching of science;
- (b) Ability to develop and sustain a program of scholarly research that relates to K-12 science education, including demonstrated capabilities or potential with regard to external grant funding; and
- (c) Experience working collegially with individuals from K-12 settings and with people from diverse backgrounds.

Appointment: Tenure-track, (Assistant Professor, Associate Professor, or Full Professor) nine-month appointment beginning August 15, 2023, or another start date as negotiated.
